Facial Recognition App

Fifty officers in the South Wales Police are to have a facial recognition app installed on their phones to identify suspects without having to take them into a police station. It is another sign that police forces are adopting the controversial technology despite being challenged in the courts.

Malicious Prosecution by Police

Three men charged with the murder of a private investigator have been awarded £414,000 from the Metropolitan Police. The case relates to charges brought in 2008 relating to the murder of Daniel Morgan in a pub car park. Judge of the High Court, Mrs Justice Cheema-Grubb announced the sums after the Court of Appeal found in their favour relating to misfeasance in public office and malicious prosecution.
